Application to deregister a political party

You should complete this form if you wish to remove your party from the register(s) of parties for Great Britain and/ or Northern Ireland.

You should note that once your party is deregistered, party candidates will not be able to use a description if standing at future elections, except for parish and community elections.



Important: your party ceases to be a registered party when the entry is removed from the register, but your reporting responsibilities do not end at that point.

If your party's gross income or total expenditure was **£25,000 or more** in your last financial year then you must continue to send us quarterly reports, annual statements of accounts and campaign expenditure reports for the year in which you deregister and the following year.

If your party's gross income or total expenditure was **less than £25,000** in the last financial year then you must submit quarterly reports, an annual statement of accounts and campaign expenditure reports for the financial year in which you deregister.

Completing and sending the form to us

You can type directly into the form and print it off to sign and send to us or you can print the form out, complete it by hand and send it to us.

Please do not submit this form electronically. The form needs a signature because it contains a declaration so you can either **post** or **fax it to us**.

Section 1 – Details of registered party

Please insert your party's name and the unique reference number that we assigned when you registered the party.

Section 2 – Declaration

Please tick the appropriate box to tell us which register you would like the party to be removed from. If you wish to be removed from both please tick both boxes.

Section 3 – Signatures

You must sign this form if you are the party's:

- leader
- nominating officer
- treasurer

If one person holds all three posts the form must also be signed by the person registered as the party's additional officer.

Section 4 – Declaration for an authorised signature

An additional officer of the party can sign this form making a declaration that they are authorised to sign in the registered officer's absence if the registered officer is unable to sign the form.



You will be making a declaration when you sign this form. You should be careful to ensure that you do not make a false declaration.

Definitions box

How the law defines the legal terms used in this note

Political party

A party registered with us under Part II Political Parties Elections and Referendums Act 2000

Register of political parties

The register of parties that intend to contest elections in England; Scotland and Wales which is maintained by the Electoral Commission and which is called the Great Britain register.

The register of parties that intend to contest elections in Northern Ireland which is maintained by the Electoral Commission and which is called the Northern Ireland register.

Annual statement of accounts

A statement of accounts prepared by the treasurer of the party and approved by the registered party leader which reports on the party's financial year. The statement of accounts must be audited if the party has a gross income and expenditure of more than £250,000.
