LONDON - TOPLINE SUMMARY

- This data is based on 723 adults aged 18+ across London.
- Interviewing took place between 6 and 28 May 2016 by telephone.
- Data are weighted to match the profile of London. Iterative weighting was applied to match the sample breakdown to the known 18+ London population by gender, age (2014 estimates) and ethnicity (census breakdown).
- Where results do not sum to 100, this is due to multiple responses, computer rounding or the exclusion of don't knows/not stated.
- Results are based on all respondents unless otherwise stated. Base sizes are in brackets.
- An asterisk (*) represents a value of less than one half of one percent, but not zero.
- Study undertaken by BMG Research on behalf of the Electoral Commission.
