**ELECTORAL REVIEW OF CORNWALL:**

Thank you for your email of 28 March setting out your views in respect of the review of electoral arrangements in Cornwall.

Your views have been noted, and will be taken into account by the Boundary Committee in formulating its draft recommendations. Please note that this stage of the review is a public consultation, and the Committee places great importance on ensuring openness and transparency in the way it deals with all representations. Accordingly, at the end of this stage of the review, 21 April 2008, full copies of all representations received will be made available for public inspection at our offices in Trevelyan House, and at those of the Council. Similarly, full copies of all submissions received will also be available for viewing on the Committee's website, [www.boundarycommittee.org.uk](http://www.boundarycommittee.org.uk).

If you do not wish your personal details, i.e. name and address, to be made public in this manner then you must inform the Committee of your wishes as a matter of urgency. However, in that event, the Committee will be unable to take your representation into account.

We are a mining parish. Indeed, the Parish of Gwennap once encompassed the neighbouring Carharrack & St Day and was world reknown as a mining centre. In the future Unitary arrangements, we would like to be "clustered" with our fellow mining parishes of St Day, Lanner and Carharrack. This would overcome existing problems where we sit at the meeting table with these parishes on several matters but have problems because we belong to different District Councils. It would be so much easier to be represented by the same Councillor/organisation.
