

This statement sets out the standards that you can expect from the Electoral Commission when we collect or hold personal information about you; how you can get access to your personal data; and what you can do if you think standards are not being met.

Personal data is information relating to living individuals. Such information is protected by the Data Protection Act 1998 and any information the Commission holds or processes must be maintained in accordance with that Act.

When we collect personal information, we will:

- explain why we need it
- ask only for what is needed, and not collect too much or irrelevant information
- protect it and make sure nobody has access to it who shouldn't
- make sure it is not kept longer than necessary and
- not make your personal information available for commercial use without your permission.

In return, we ask you to:

- give us accurate information and
- tell us as soon as possible if there are any changes, such as a new address

This helps us to keep your information reliable and up to date.

The Commission holds personal data relating to:

- copies of electoral register
- correspondence or complaints from individuals
- information obtained during investigations conducted through the Commission's powers under the Political Parties Elections and Referendums Act 2000 and the Political Parties and Elections Act 2009
- consultation responses
- job applications and human resources data relating to current and former employees

In relation to this information, we promise to use the information only for the purpose for which it was provided. We will ensure the data is protected and is not accessible to anyone who should not have access. We will make sure it is not kept longer than necessary. We will also not allow your information to be used for commercial purposes without the permission.
