They also did not wish to be managed by Norfolk and therefore did not want to be grouped with Lowestoft as they may become part of a Norfolk authority.
3	Thurston Parish Council	<p>At its meeting this week, Thurston Parish Council agreed to recommend the option of one Suffolk Unitary Authority. The other options currently proposed this Council sees unfair insofar as all options mooting two UA's divide the County into mainly rural and mainly commercial. The workload of any of these combinations of two would therefore be unfairly diverse. Thurston PC is also concerned about the extra work which, it seems, is inevitably going to land at the doors of Parish and Town Councils.
