### **Electoral Review for the Cornwall Unitary Authority**

Carharrack Parish Council very strongly considers that the existing Cornwall County Council ward of Carharrack, Lanner and St. Day should remain an electoral division following the Electoral Review.

St. Day parish, an immediate neighbour to the north, has a great deal in common with Carharrack, both being villages with an extensive history involving mining in Cornwall with disused engine houses dominating the landscape and Lanner parish is similarly placed on the south side. Carn Marth is shared with Lanner, this geographical feature uniting, not dividing, the parishes. All three parishes were founder members of the Mining Villages Regeneration Group, each benefiting from various improvements funded by this project; similarly each is receiving enhancements under the Mineral Tramways Project.

The three mining villages are being well served by the present County Councillor since problems - traffic, affordable housing, regeneration, encouragement of village life - are common to each one and can thus be tackled in a similar fashion. Councillors would be so grateful if this long standing unity was not broken up, please.
