Thank you for your email to the Electoral Commission dated 26 November 2017.

The Commission aims to respond to requests for information promptly and regrets that on this occasion we have not done so.

Your request is in bold below followed by our response.

I am writing to make a request under the Freedom of Information Act for:

- 1. A list of all email and document-based (for example but not limited to letter, memo, fax, etc) communication between the Electoral Commission and Vote Leave (including any recognised members of Vote Leave), between 1 January 2016 and today's date, 26 November 2017. For each item in the list, please provide the date the communication was sent or received, the name of the sender and recipient, the title or reference of the item, and a summary description of the item's contents.
- 2. Copies of all the email and document-based (for example but not limited to letter, memo, fax, etc) communication between the Electoral Commission and Vote Leave (including any recognised members of Vote Leave), between 1 January 2016 and today's date, 26 November 2017.

If my request is refused either in whole or in part, please make specific reference to exemptions within FOIA.

Our response is as follows:

We hold the information you have requested.

The Commission has previously released correspondence under a FOI request from 1 January 2016 to 30 June 2016 between us and Vote Leave (see here). This includes correspondence with individuals associated with Vote Leave. Therefore, this request releases relevant correspondence between 1 July 2016 and 26 November 2017.

You will find the name of the sender/receiver of the correspondence and dates in

the attached correspondence. We have not provided you with a list or a summary of the items' contents as we are not required to do this under the Act.

Exemptions under Section 31

You will be aware that the Commission has opened an investigation into Vote Leave's EU referendum spending return (see statement on our website here). In light of this investigation, the Commission has applied exemptions to some correspondence which relates to this investigation. This includes correspondence prior to the opening of the investigation which forms part of our investigation. Section 31(1)(g) of the FOI Act provides for exemption from disclosure of information which has been held at any time for a variety of law enforcement interests. For example, information may be exempt under section 31(1)(g) if its disclosure under the FOI Act would, or would be likely to, prejudice the prevention or detection of crime. The exemption under section 31(1)(g) is subject to the public interest test. We are satisfied that given the ongoing investigation it is not in the public interest to release this information.

Exemptions under Section 40

You will notice that certain personal details have been redacted from the documents we are releasing. This redaction is necessary because section 40(2) and (3)(a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI) Act provides that personal data, where its disclosure would breach one of the data protection principles, is exempt from disclosure. The first data protection principle states that personal data must be processed fairly and lawfully. The Commission considers that it would be unfair to release the names and personal contact details of junior officials, who were not employed in public facing roles and did not act as spokespersons for their employer, as those individuals would have a reasonable expectation that this personal data would not be disclosed to the general public.

I trust that this information satisfies your request. The Commission strives to be an open, transparent authority. I had the following questions:

Do I need to record separately all amounts given by any donor who gave over £7,500. By way of example:

gave several separate amounts of £100,000 and e.g. £2,000 and a non-monetary donation of approx £4,300.

Do I:

- a. Aggregate all the amounts of his donations whether or not monetary or non-monetary and put as the received date the date of the last donation and the treatment date the date that he was accepted? OR
- b. Aggregate all the amounts of his donations whether ro not monetary or non-monetary and put as the received date teh date on which his donations first exceeded £7,500 and treatment date the date on which he was first accepted; OR
- c. Aggregate all of the amounts of his monetary donations using the received date as the date of the first donation over 500 and treatment date as the date when checked he was an eligible donor and the same but separately for his non-monetary donations only to the extent that they, separately are over £7,500 and they being under £7,500 should only form part of the bulk amount of donations over 500 but under £7,500?
- d. Because his total donations are over £7,500, record all of his donations separately whether or not they were individually over £7,500 and whether or not monetary or non-monetary with the date on which each was received and the date on which he was first accepted as a donor; OR
- e. Record separately and on a named basis only his donations in value over £7,500 and put all his separate donations under £7,500 in the bulk amount for those between £500 and £7,500.

If the answer is c. for those individuals who gave lower individual amounts but which added to over £7,500 do I put all of their separate donations in on each received date or the total amount with the received date, the date on which their donations exceeded £7,500?

I am mindful that the course we followed for the pre-poll donations initially was d. but that you then removed all of the individual donations under £7,500.

A prompt response would be very much appreciated.


