Scottish Local Council elections – May 2017

Methodology

- This data is based upon the results from 751 telephone interviews conducted across Scotland between the 5 May and 5 June. Interviews were conducted with a nationally representative sample of adults aged 16 and over. Data is weighted to match the profile of the population.
- Where relevant, figures are compared with the results from the equivalent survey which fielded after the 2012 Scottish local council election. In 2012 fieldwork took place between 4 and 22 May 2012 and comprised 1000 interviews with adults aged 18 and over.
- In 2017 and in 2012, fieldwork was conducted by ICM.

Headline findings

- Satisfaction with the registration system has improved, from 84% in 2012 to 88% in 2017.
- General satisfaction with the procedures for voting in elections and referendums in Great Britain has also appears to have improved with 78% saying they are generally satisfied, up from 74% in 2012.
- Over eight in ten (82%) said they were confident that the polls held on May 4 were well run, again an improvement on the 75% that felt this way in 2012.
- Just 40% felt that there was ‘a lot of media coverage’ on the Scottish Council elections while 60% thought that the elections were overshadowed by the announcement of the parliamentary general election.
- Despite this, nine in ten voters (91%) said they found it easy to access information on how to cast their vote, although a smaller proportion (73%) said they found it easy to access information on the candidates standing.

- In line with this, 94% of those that voted on 4 May said that they had found it easy to complete their ballot paper with 73% saying they found it very easy. Those aged between 18 and 34 were the most likely to say that they had found it difficult: 16% said they felt this way, compared with just 2% of 35-54s and 3% of over 55s.

Full questionnaire and responses

- Where results do not sum to 100, this is due to multiple responses, computer rounding or the exclusion of don't knows/not stated.
- Results are based on all respondents unless otherwise stated. Base sizes are in brackets.
- An asterisk (*) represents a value of less than one half of one percent, but not zero.
