

TOPLINE SUMMARY: UK REPORT

- This data is based on 3533 adults aged 18+ across the United Kingdom, incorporating 1526 adults in England, 753 in Scotland, 751 in Wales and 503 in Northern Ireland.
- Interviewing took place between 24 June and 14 July 2016 by telephone.
- Data are weighted to match the profile of UK regions. Iterative weighting was applied to match the sample breakdown within each Government Office Region (GOR) to the known 18+ population by gender, age (2014 estimates) and ethnicity (census breakdown). Additionally, within Wales and Scotland, demographic weighting was applied at a sub-regional level to reflect the wide disparity in linguistic and population density statistics across both of these countries. The sub-regions used are former NUTS areas, and are detailed in the individual reports for each country. Northern Ireland was treated as a single entity. A multiplier was then attached to the demographically-weighted data for each GOR/sub-region to reflect their relative contribution to the population.
- Where results do not sum to 100%, this may be due to the question allowing multiple responses, or in the case of single response questions, summing proportions which have been rounded to zero decimal places.
- Results are based on all respondents unless otherwise stated. Base sizes for filtered questions are indicated in parentheses.
- An asterisk (*) represents a value of less than one half of one percent, but not zero.

Summary of Key Results

- Overall, 87% of respondents say that they are satisfied to some degree with the procedure for electoral registration, around two-thirds (63%) report that they are very satisfied with the process, whilst around one quarter (23%) say that they are fairly satisfied.
- Of those who were registered, almost four fifths (78%) said that they registered more than 6 months before. Around 10% said that they registered in the final few months and weeks ahead of the deadline (7% final few months, 3% in the final few days). 2% of respondents said that they registered in the final few days.
- In 2016 more than four in five respondents (84%) said that they were satisfied with the procedure for voting in elections. Almost half (47%) said they were very satisfied, and almost four in ten (38%) were satisfied.
- More than three quarters of respondents (77%) said that they were confident that the referendum was well run. Just over one third (36%) of respondents said that they were very confident that the referendum was run well, and more than four in ten (42%) said that they were fairly confident.
- For those who said that they were confident that the referendum was run well, the top reasons given were; that it was well organised (22%), voting was quick and easy (14%), the voting system was fair (12%) and that the ballot paper was clear and concise making it easy to vote (11%).
- For those who said that they were not confident that the referendum was run well, the top reasons given were; that there was a lack of information in general (20%), there was a lack of information about what would happen as a result of a vote to remain/leave (12%) and that the information received was confusing or that they didn't understand what the vote was for (12%). A mistrust of politicians was also cited highly (13%), as was misinformation and allegations as to what the vote was about (13%).
- On electoral fraud; more than three quarters (77%) said that they felt voting, in general, was safe from fraud and abuse. This view was strongest among respondents in Northern Ireland (84%) and lowest from those in England (76%).
- The results for voting by post show that notably fewer people think that it is safe from fraud and abuse, when compared to elections in general. Around three in five (61%) said that they felt postal voting was safe. While respondents from Scotland report the highest level of perceived safety for postal voting (63%), those in Northern Ireland report the lowest (54%), 9 percentage points lower.
- More than four fifths (84%) said they felt that knew a great deal (34%) or a fair amount (50%) about the EU Referendum. Just 2% felt they knew nothing at all.
