### May 2021 elections: publication of resources to support local communications activity

As set out in [Bulletin 269](#), we are taking a phased approach to our communications activity for the May 2021 elections so we can be responsive to the changing environment, while still supporting our wide range of stakeholders.

In line with the plans we've outlined for Phase 1, we have created [a set of resources](#) to support your work at a local level in raising awareness of options people have about how to vote. This responds to discussions across the electoral community, and an appetite for clear and consistent messaging for voters.

We want voters to know that:

- polling stations will be safe places to vote
- there are a range of voting options
- those who would prefer to vote by post should apply early

The resources include a version covering all three of the key messages, as well as versions with each message individually, to give you flexibility about how you promote the messages locally.

Resources include:

- a template press release
- an FAQ document
- social media images
- web banners (MPU)
- posters

We have also provided a logo placement guide to support you in adding your own logo to the social media images and poster artwork.
