When receiving nominations, Returning Officers must check that the party name or any description given on a nomination form, as well as the requested emblem, is registered on [the Commission's register of political parties](#) and that the details provided match the registration. To ensure that you are viewing the most up-to-date information, you may need to delete your browser history or refresh the page. If you are unsure how to do this, your IT team should be able to advise you.

May 2021 elections: guidance on the management of paper

We have received a number of queries on working with and handling paper at the May polls, and we thought it would be helpful to reiterate our advice in this area, which has been informed by our national public health bodies.

Advice from our national public health bodies remains that as long as all those working with or handling paper take care to only be present if well, avoid touching their faces, and regularly and frequently clean their hands, there is no need to quarantine ballot papers before commencing the verification or count process. This guidance is reflected within the update to our supplementary verification and count guidance which was highlighted in [Bulletin 283](#).

May 2021 election: further call for polling station data

As set out in [Bulletin 281](#), we are once again running a polling station finder, in partnership with Democracy Club, to help make sure voters have access to accurate and timely information about how and where they can vote.

It has been agreed that EROs in Scotland will share their polling place information with Democracy Club to help make sure voters head to the right polling place. By having this information easily available online, it should help to reduce the number of calls you'll get from voters looking for this information.

Providing your data is straightforward. You can export the data from your EMS, and email it to pollingstations@democracyclub.org.uk.
