May 2021 elections: COVID-19 emergency proxy application form

Further to [Bulletin 297](#), we have now made available a [COVID-19 emergency proxy application form](#) for use at the May elections.

The form will allow electors to apply:

- for an emergency proxy if they are self-isolating
- to appoint a new proxy if their existing proxy is self-isolating

EROs should note that where an elector has a permanent proxy arrangement in place and applies to change their proxy appointment due to COVID-19, the newly appointed proxy will remain as their appointed proxy for future polls. Whilst the form makes this clear, you could also contact any such electors after the election and explain the situation, making it clear that they would need to make a further application to re-appoint their original proxy.

You can find our guidance for EROs on processing proxy applications [here](#). As always, it will be important to process new applications as soon as practicable to ensure that your absent voter lists are up to date and available to candidates and political parties upon request.

May 2021 elections: polling station staff survey

We are working with two academics, Alistair Clark (Newcastle University) and Toby James (University of East Anglia), on a survey of polling station staff.

The survey is designed to collect feedback from staff about their polling day experiences, with a specific focus on the impact of the COVID-related measures in place this year. The survey will run from 6 May to 11 June. We will publish a summary of the survey findings in a future Bulletin.

We would appreciate your help in sharing this survey with your polling station staff. To support you in doing this, we've created a [one-page resource](#) which contains a scannable QR code. Polling station staff would be able to scan the code with a smartphone and complete the survey online via their device. The link to the survey will go live on the afternoon of polling day. Alternatively, in the week after polling day we will provide you with a link to the online survey, which you could then e-mail to polling station staff.

May 2021 elections: post-election feedback and data collection

As at previous elections, we will once again be collecting feedback and data on the administration of the polls.

Electoral administration feedback

Your feedback is important to us – it will not only inform our post-election reporting but will also help us to improve how we support you in delivering well-run elections in the future. The survey will be similar to ones issued after previous polls and will seek your views on various aspects of the poll including voter registration, nominations, polling day and the count. This year we would additionally like to hear how you dealt with the COVID-related impacts in your area and how these have affected your work during the polls. We will also be asking for your thoughts on the guidance and support provided by the Commission.

The [survey link](#) will be made live on Monday 10 May and the deadline for completion will be Friday 11 June.

Data collection

As highlighted in [Bulletin 293](#), we will once again be collecting [key administrative data](#) from Returning Officers. This data provides important evidence to support our work in reporting on elections in the UK.
