Our response is as follows:

We hold some of the information you have requested, however it is exempt from disclosure under section 21 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Section 21 provides for an exemption where the information requested is reasonably accessible to the applicant by other means. The information that you have requested is accessible to you by using our online register of donations to political parties.

When political parties report their donations to us, they must include certain details about the donor. Where the donor is a company, the required detail to be reported is the company's registered name, the address of its registered office and its Companies House registration number. We publish the donations reported to us by political parties on our online register of donations to political parties.

The online register of donations is searchable by a number of other criteria and can be found [here](#). You will need to enter the name of the company that you are interested in.
