

Route Switching

Moving properties from one route to another

This worksheet outlines the situations in which EROs can or must move properties from one route to another.

From Route 1 to Route 2

Must be completed prior to commencing a route

1 Properties with an elector who has **recently been added** to the electoral register. Please note that EROs can set their 'recent additions' threshold at any point between 0 and 90 days.

2 Properties with an elector where EROs have received **one piece of deletion evidence** where two pieces of evidence are needed.

3 Properties with individuals whose application to register to vote has been **successfully determined by the ERO** but who have not yet been added onto the register.

4 Properties with individuals who have the **potential to become electors** as they are involved in an Invitation to Register (ITR) chasing cycle.

5 Properties with an elector who is **set to be deleted** from the register in the next monthly update, also up to a 90-day threshold.

6 **Any property**, if the ERO feels a Route 2 canvass might be more appropriate.

From Route 1 to Route 2

Can be completed at any point within Route 1

1 If EROs receive **incomplete information** on a property in response to a Route 1 communication, it is a legal requirement to move those properties from Route 1 to Route 2.

For example, if electors state that a housemate has moved out, but do not provide the name of the housemate, EROs would have to move these properties to Route 2.

These individuals will become full electors when the next monthly alteration of the register is published.

From Route 3 to Route 2

Can be completed at any point within Route 3

1 Properties where EROs have **not received a response** for the data requested from the responsible person.
