May 2022 elections: post-election feedback and data collection

Last week saw the delivery of the local government elections across the whole of Wales.

These important elections were the first local elections where 16 and 17 year olds and foreign citizens legally resident in Wales were able to vote.

In the four local authority areas of Blaenau Gwent, Bridgend, Caerphilly and Torfaen flexible voting pilots also took place to test different forms of advance voting.

The elections marked the culmination of substantial efforts from across the electoral community. Electoral administrators, polling station staff and many others have worked hard to support voter registration, enable postal and polling station voting, and count the votes that have been cast.

The delivery of these polls is a testament to your commitment to the democratic process.

The Commission will now start a process of information gathering and evaluation so that we can formally report in the autumn on how the elections were delivered, and on the experiences of voters, candidates, campaigners and administrators.

As part of this process, we will once again be asking for your support in providing us with data and feedback to inform our reporting. Thank you to everyone who has already completed the available surveys or distributed survey links.
