The Electoral Commission

In the UK, you are legally required to show photo identification (ID) when voting at a polling station at some elections (the 'voter ID requirement').



Anyone who does not have an accepted form of photo ID can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

We know that some groups are more likely to experience barriers in preparing for this change and may need support to access photo ID.



Organisations working directly with voters, including local authorities and charities, can play an important role in supporting voters to ensure they have photo ID they can use to vote.

We've created this pack to help organisations raise awareness, and support the people you work with to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate, if needed. These resources also include information on voter registration.

These graphics can be seamlessly displayed in any web size without compromising resolution.



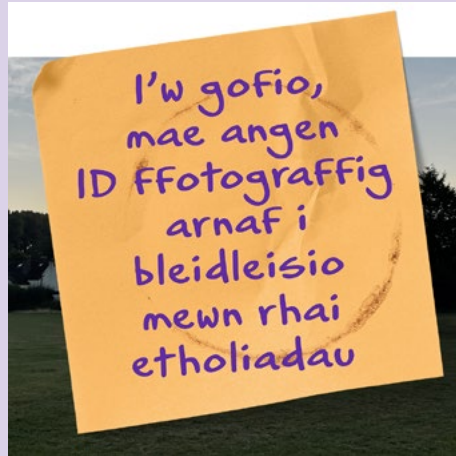
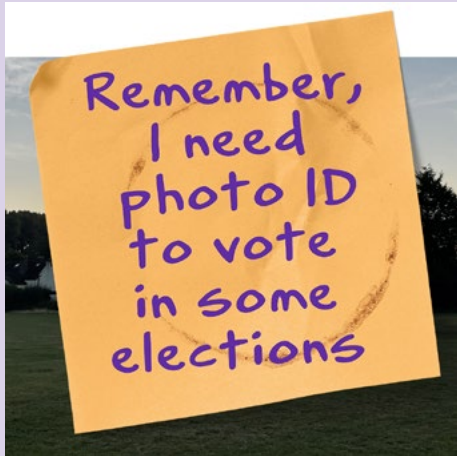

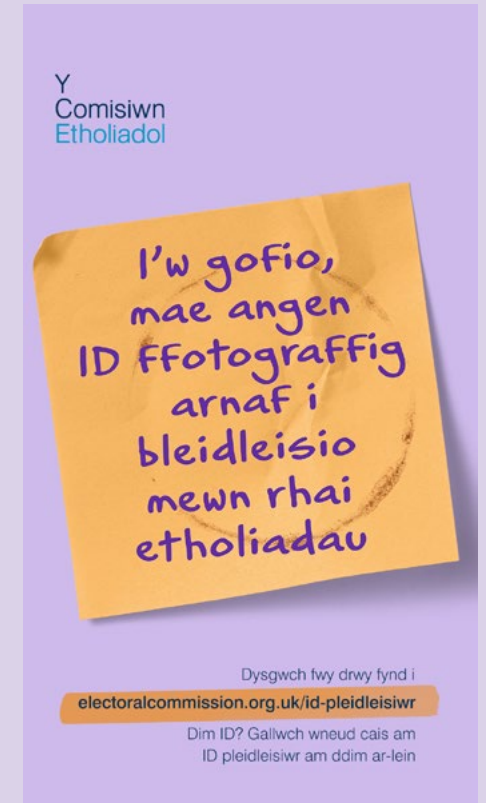
