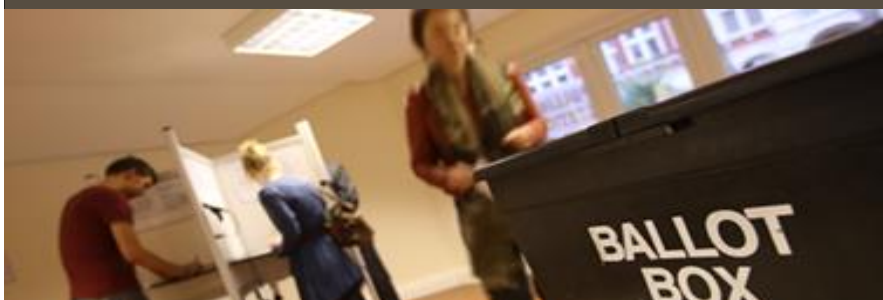

## Elections Act: legislation and guidance update

The UK Government laid three Statutory Instruments (SIs) before Parliament on 6 July relating to Elections Act measures:

- [Representation of the People \(Postal and Proxy Voting etc.\) \(Amendment\) Regulations 2023](#) – these cover the online absent vote application service and changes to postal and proxy voting arrangements (OAVA/PPVR)
- [Representation of the People \(Franchise Amendment and Eligibility Review\) Regulations 2023](#) – these cover the changes to the voting and candidacy rights of EU citizens (EUVC)
- [Mayoral and Police and Crime Commissioner Elections, Recall Petitions and Referendums \(Ballot Secrecy, Candidates and Undue Influence\) Regulations 2023](#) – these cover a range of other measures from the Act, including the new electoral sanction for intimidation.

Further to the laying of these SIs, we have updated our [key considerations planning guidance](#), including to reflect the absent voting transitional arrangements as set out in the OAVA/PPVR SI, which are different to those provided for in the earlier published version of the SI and which had informed our original planning assumptions. We have also included within it a link to our recently published [guidance on polling district reviews](#).

The key considerations guidance will remain a living document as further detail emerges. A change log has been added to the guidance to help you easily identify what changes have been made, and we will also highlight further amendments or additions through the Bulletin as usual.
