Elections Act: publication of absent voting guidance

As set out in [Bulletin 344](#), we are in the process of updating our core guidance to support you with the delivery of the next phase of changes arising out of the Elections Act 2022.

We have now published updated [core guidance for EROs](#) to support the changes to the absent voting process for UK Parliamentary and PCC elections, which we expect to come into force on 31 October 2023.

It has been developed in close consultation with colleagues from across the electoral community, including the Association of Electoral Administrators (AEA), Scottish Assessors Association (SAA), Society of Local Authority Chief Executives (Solace), the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) and the Elections, Registration and Referendums Working Group (ERRWG).

Until the new provisions come into force, the current rules continue to apply so we have published the updated guidance alongside the existing absent voting guidance. The titles of the updated guidance pages indicate clearly that they apply post-commencement of the new legislation, to help you distinguish between the two different sets of guidance.

Once the new legislation comes into force, the existing guidance will be removed from the website.
