UK Parliamentary general elections: guidance update

As set out in [Bulletin 326](#), we have now updated [our core guidance for Returning Officers for UK Parliamentary general elections](#). This guidance is now available as web-based HTML content.

The updated guidance reflects changes introduced by the Elections Act 2022 such as the new postal vote handling measures and the updated undue influence and intimidation offences. Full details of the changes can be found in the change log at the start of the guidance.

The detailed process for the handing in of postal votes at polling stations is currently being developed, in close consultation with the Elections, Referendums and Registration Working Group (ERRWG) which includes representatives from the EMB and the SAA. We will further update our core guidance to reflect this process as appropriate once this work has been completed, in January 2024.

We are currently finalising updates to our guidance for candidates and agents at UK Parliamentary general elections and will publish this in web-based HTML format at the end of November.

As always, we will notify you through the Bulletin when any further updates to the guidance and additional resources are published.

Elections Act: Amended timetable for guidance on overseas electors

Further to [Bulletin 326](#) where we set out our plans for updating our guidance to reflect the Elections Act changes, we have now amended the timetable for publication of the guidance for EROs on overseas electors.

The detailed secondary legislation giving effect to the changes was amended after pre-laying scrutiny by the Joint Committee for Statutory Instruments (JCSI) which means we now need to make amends to our draft guidance to ensure it fully and accurately reflects the [final regulations](#) which were laid on 23 October.

The guidance will now be published by mid-December, rather than at the end of November as originally planned.
