A UK Parliament general election will take place before the end of January 2025, and you will need to show photo ID to vote in person.

There are various forms of photo ID you can use, including a:

- Passport
- Driving licence (including provisional)
- Older persons bus pass
- Disabled persons bus pass
- Physical identity card with a PASS mark (including Young Scot Card)

Other forms of photo ID will also be accepted. If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID, you can apply for free voter ID, known as a Voter Authority Certificate.
