Issue 370 (Wales) – 22 May 2024

Updates to canvass forms to bring them in line with Elections Act changes.

The Elections Act 2022 introduced a number of changes to our suite of forms. We have now updated our canvass communications to reflect changes to postal and proxy voting rights and EU citizens voting rights.

These changes are seen in the following sections:

- Who is eligible to vote – this incorporates changes to the voting rights of EU citizens by updating the section which gives information on the registration criteria for EU citizens;
- Postal and proxy votes – the forms now acknowledge the changes made to postal and proxy voting rights by dividing the columns, where applicable, for which election members of the household wish to vote in; and
- The privacy statements – these have been updated to have similar wording to the ITR forms.

The full suite of forms have undergone consultation across all governments in Great Britain and have received Ministerial approval.

All of the canvass communications we produce are prescribed in law – as such both the content and layout must not be changed by EROs or any suppliers they use to support their electoral registration activity.

This also applies to the ITR and ECR (Eligibility Confirmation Review) templates we have published on our website (as detailed in [bulletin 366](#)) which also must not be amended.
