UKPGE: A message from the Commission

Following the UK general election last week, the focus is on politics and the results and not on the process of running the poll. This is exactly as it should be, reflecting that the election was generally well-run.

And this didn't happen by accident - we are only in this position as a result of the significant efforts and intense work of electoral administrators across the UK. It is to the credit of Returning Officers, Electoral Registration Officers and their teams that the poll was delivered successfully at short notice.

However, we all know about the pressures on electoral administrators in running a general election within the current framework, and we know that there were instances where electors did not receive the standard of service we would all want them to.

As you can see below, we are now focussed on collecting feedback and data to inform our post-election reporting. We will use this opportunity to fully review the election and consider any recommendations - whether for us, governments or the electoral community - that could improve the process in the future.

- Core administrative data (deadline: Friday 16 August)
