Photo ID is not required in Scottish Parliament and Senedd elections, or local elections and by-elections in Scotland and Wales.

You need to show photo ID when voting at a polling station in some elections. A wide range of photo ID will be accepted, including passports, driving licences and cards with a PASS mark.

The name on your ID should be the same name you used to register to vote. If you don't have an accepted form of ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document known as a Voter Authority Certificate.
