Thank you for your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 dated 6th June 2016.

The Commission aims to respond to requests for information promptly and has done so within the statutory timeframe of twenty working days.

Your request is in bold below followed by our response.

You have requested:

With the referendum on The United Kingdom's membership of the European Referendum fast approaching, I was wondering if you could let us know how many people are registered to vote for it. With changes to how you can register having been implemented, and with this being such an important vote for every generation living and all those to come, I would be fascinated to know just how many people can actually vote on the 23rd June.

Our response is as follows:

The final registered electorate for the referendum on the UK's membership of the EU was 46,500,501. This represented a 4.6% increase on the equivalent registered electorate on 1 December 2015.

I trust that this information satisfies your request. The Commission strives to be an open, transparent authority.
